

#### Media Literacy

The world is becoming a global village with information easier to access. Modern people can absorb a massive amount of information every day, but in this vast sea of data, which is true, and which is false? Some information may be deliberately exaggerated and important facts may be concealed. These are obstacles blocking us from obtaining the correct information. When reading the news and watching TV, how can the audience judge whether the information is correct? When can people live in a society with accurate information? What can we do to avoid, or perhaps reduce the rampant spread of fake information?

The ability to identify information is "media literacy". Media literacy puts an emphasis on the presence of independent critical thinking when the individuals are accessing information. Media literacy is a crucial skill for all citizens. What is more dangerous is not the falsehood itself, but people without media literacy, since they may believe the false information. They might even lend a hand in spreading it unconsciously.

A key word in media literacy is "fake news" . A research paper entitled Varieties of Democracy, An Approach to Conceptualizing and Measuring Democracy Worldwide, indicated that Taiwan ranked at the top in disseminating and receiving fake news, which could have great influence on domestic politics. It's a warning signal that fake news often appears in Taiwan.

As an example of fake news, one titled "A massive COVID-19 outbreak among Vietnamese in Taipei City?" was circulating on the Internet, claiming that Taiwan is

imposing an emergency lockdown after 250 Vietnamese in Taiwan were infected with COVID-19. The Central **Epidemic Command Center** pointed out that it was fake news and urged citizens not to spread, forward or repost any epidemic-related information from an unknown source unless it was verified. After numerous





times of being forwarded and disseminated, fake news may disturb people's thoughts or even lead to

the public's distrust of the government.

It impacts not only individuals but also the entire society. Media literacy is not just a personal capability; it has the power to influence the whole nation.

So how does the government combat disinformation? In Taiwan, the 3Fs principle, which stands for "fast, fair, and fun", is held to deal with such phenomena. As the

implementation of the three core ideas, the authorities concerned publish statements and images with simple messages in order to capture people's attention, and in turn explain the facts. It turns out to be more efficient to clarify fake news. On the other hand, the media literacy lesson plans were developed to enhance our ability to detect fake news. The National Communications Commission subsidizes media literacy education and workshops, and the Ministry of Education has also planned a series of courses to include media literacy in the curriculum. Besides, websites are set up to provide online courses and teaching materials for the public in the hope of cultivating students' ability to understand and analyze the current state of national defensive development and read information with media literacy. What's more, Taiwan Media Watch, an organization that values media literacy, raises funds to carry out various research related to media supervision.

To be specific in realizing media literacy, confirm the origin of news, do comprehensive reading, and check the author's background and the exact publishing date of the information or data. When accessing information, be a person with an objective view. Temporarily giving up religious beliefs and support to political parties enables us to have a better understanding of the article, and be a smart audience.

To sum up, in the fast-changing era of informatization, everyone should cultivate the ability of critical thinking and take every single piece of news rationally instead of being

easily convinced of everything by the media. Only in this way can we all become a smarter audience possessing media literacy, and make Taiwan a better environment for freedom of speech.

As common and inevitable as it is, cyberbullying may be traumatizing for any adolescent. Cyberbullying is basically making fun of someone




#### I Want To Be An Alien

If I were the alien who stayed on the earth for 400 years, I would definitely take the following actions to love the earth as well as human beings.





#### Taiwan Model

Taiwan, the safest country around the globe in 2020. As the only country to host "Phantom of the Opera" recently, Taiwan has maintained a safe society during the pandemic! Pavel Fischer, a diplomat from the Czech Republic, stated that it is risky to exclude Taiwan from active participation in the WHO. That is definitely something worthy of celebration, since the importance of Taiwan has been unveiled to the whole world, but how could we receive such praise during the pandemic? The press conferences provide clear and comprehensive information about the number of cases, new policies and free lectures on health



education. Taking the steps mentioned above requires experienced professionals in the medical field, which is especially crucial during this severe pandemic. As Taiwanese citizens and residents, we feel really fortunate to have these professionals and realize that it is essential to have a responsible government.

Meanwhile, Taiwan has joined hands with

international partners to help contain the outbreak. For example, the Ministry Of Foreign Affairs and the American Institute in Taiwan issued the Taiwan-US Joint Statement on a Partnership against Coronavirus with the goal of using their combined expertise to help tackle the pandemic, including comprehensive research and into rapid test kits, medicines, and vaccines. Other than that, from the onset of the COVID-19 outbreak, Taiwan has notified the WHO of new confirmed cases, as well as anti-pandemic efforts



including border control and quarantine measures. With the perfect combination of modern technology and medicine, a joint effort by medical professionals, the government, private sectors and ordinary members of society, we have successfully controlled the spread of the virus in the battle against COVID-19 and also convey "Taiwan can help, and Taiwan is helping!" to the world.

In addition to our outstanding performance in epidemic prevention, where else can Taiwan's influence be seen? Democracy must be mentioned! It took 40 years for Taiwan to transit from autocracy to democracy. As a newly emerging democratic country, Taiwan's democratization can be a model for other countries. #### **Human Rights Diplomacy**

"Human rights" has become a popular keyword on the Internet. Since the Taiwanese government declared the lifting of martial laws in 1987, Taiwan has passed a considerable amount of policies and acts to create a "human rights-friendly" society. The annual report, "Country Reports on Human Rights Practices," submitted from Freedom House and the United States Department of State has approved the progress Taiwan made in human rights. Taiwan has since become a champion of human rights.

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs first mentioned the concept of Human Rights Diplomacy under former president Chen. To promote human rights, the government made new laws and set up institutions to supervise and evaluate the execution of the plans and the results as well. The following were steps we adopted: First, the government set up associations for human rights, and then legislated the International Bill of Human Rights, making it a domestic law, which is the so-called Enforcement Act of The International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights and The International Covenant on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights. By doing so, we could make up for the deficiency of the Constitution of the Republic of China, ensuring human rights for everyone in Taiwan.

Human Rights Diplomacy refers to integrating human rights issues with bilateral relationships such as economic and trade partnerships. It isn't merely a policy. It is a strategy to form values for pursuing freedom and democracy. Human Rights Diplomacy was first practiced officially by the Carter government.

Back in the late 1970s, the U.S. gained support from around the world to contend with totalitarian regimes. Since then, Human Rights Diplomacy has been an essential way to consolidate the values of democracy.

As the importance of human rights is being emphasized, persecution of human rights is receiving more and more attention as well. Take Hong Kong's Anti-Extradition Movement, which began in 2019, for example. During the protests, constant conflicts between the police and the citizens were seen day by day with more than 10,000 people arrested. Seeing such acts of suppressing human rights and democracy, the US President Donald Trump signed the Hong Kong Human Rights and Democracy Act on November 27th, 2019, imposing property and visa-blocking sanctions on the officials held responsible for human rights violations. As for Taiwan, the government has run an asylum mechanism for Hong Kong protestors, and has since received asylum applications

from at least 200 Hong Kongers offering them counseling for

employment, school attendance and help settling in to life in Taiwan. By standing together against the suppression of

human rights and embracing democratic values, we have established a democratic front line in Asia, and we will proceed to consolidate the values for human rights.

Since there are no boundaries in promoting human rights, the concerning diplomatic policies were also carried out in Europe. For instance, over the past few months, Taiwan has respectively signed conventions with Poland, Denmark, and the like, which includes comprehensive content such as cooperation in criminal justice. Just like our president said, "Democracy is in our DNA. It is what makes

us Taiwanese." Democratic countries holding the same belief around the world should cooperate more closely to implement that spirit, whereas human rights are the most pivotal part in democracy.

It can't be denied that human rights benefit all mankind. Not only the people in our country, but also people from other nations, those that have been persecuted for such a long period. Although being excluded from international organizations, we regard human rights as our most divine principle and do our utmost to safeguard it! We put human rights diplomacy into practice and speak up for the persecuted and the disadvantaged. Taiwan will persevere in having them sheltered and helping them out! Today, we stand together and we fight against the violation of human rights!


