For example, Gunplas are often scaled at 1/100, meaning they are 100 times smaller than the original Gundam. Apart from Gunplas, plane and tank models are also available to be built. In our club, we mostly specialize in building Gunpla. Gunpla, short for "Gundam Plastic Model," is the ultimate hobby for fans of the Japanese anime franchise, Mobile Suit Gundam. These plastic model kits allow you to build your own mini mechas to recreate scenes from the anime.



Gunpla kits are made of injection-molded plastic and typically come in several pieces that must be assembled by the modeler. The kits can vary



in complexity, with some requiring simple snap-together assembly while others may require glue and paint to complete. Many Gunpla kits also come with a variety of optional parts and weapons, allowing the modeler to customize their creation.

The process of building a Gunpla kit can be separated into three main steps: cutting the pieces off the mold, using sandpaper to remove any blemishes, and assembling. Building models might seem easy, just snip off the parts and attach them together. Although this is quite fun and doesn't take up a lot of time, the end product won't look good. One of the most fundamental skills a modeler needs is the ability to remove imperfections from a piece. Since most scale model parts are injection molded, there are often blemishes present. Therefore, as modelers, we need to use sandpaper and other tools to remove these imperfections. After this step, our model is ready to be assembled.



However, there is much more that can be done to our models that can further increase its aesthetics. Looking for a battle-scarred vibe? Feel free to use a knife to make some nics in the armor, and brush on some weathering paint to give it a muddy look. Want something that looks factory new? Apply stickers and a coat of glossy finish to make it look shiny and clean. You can even build some scenery to suit the look of your Gundam. These steps are what truly elevates our model to the next level.

As with any hobby, there are various levels of commitment and skill involved in Gunpla modeling. Some modelers enjoy the simple satisfaction of snapping the pieces together and leaving the kit as is, while others may take the time to paint and customize their creations to a high level of detail. Many modelers also enjoy competing in Gunpla modeling contests, where judges evaluate the accuracy and overall quality of the completed models.

Gunpla models can be an enjoyable and rewarding hobby for people of all ages. In addition to the satisfaction of building and customizing the models, the hobby also promotes creativity, attention to detail, and patience. 








Tattoo-art on The Body
