

#### Monash University Change It Challenge 2026 Competition

Dear Principals, Teachers, and Students,

In a world of frequent and constant changes, we are now proposing a challenge for your students to create the future we need. As we address the challenges of the age – from climate change through to building thriving communities, we would like to encourage your grade 10 and 11 students to participate in our Change it Challenge competition.

To participate in the competition, students have to form teams of maximum three members and choose from a list of topics that concerns them the most, and come up with a creative solution on how they would solve the concern.

We will conduct an in-country final to be held in Taipei in March 2026 (detailed to be confirmed) where a winning team will be selected to represent Taiwan with a paid trip to spend a week in Melbourne in July/August 2026 to compete against all the other Countries winners for the grand prize. The school counsellor from the winning school will be requested to accompany their students for the Melbourne trip.

To help inform students across Taiwan, we have attached the official event poster and flyer. We kindly ask for your support in displaying it on campus or posting the event information on your institution's website.



- Systemic social issues of inequality and disadvantage, intolerance, discrimination and violence.



### WHAT IS THE MONASH UNIVERSITY CHANGE IT CHALLENGE?

Monash University's Change It Challenge is a competition to make your change and have your voice heard.

Join us in helping solve some of the challenges of the age — from climate change through to building thriving communities. Once you've chosen a challenge to focus on, we want you to choose the issue that concerns you the most or are most passionate about, think about how it affects where you live and share with us what you would do to change it and why.





#### **ROUND ONE - Upload your entry**

#### STEP 1

#### Your challenge is to answer these questions:

- 1. Which challenges of the age (climate change or thriving communities) concerns you the most? Which issue within this challenge is of the most concern to you and how does it affect where you live?
- 2. How will you create the change the world needs?

#### STEP 2

Present your findings in a 3 minute video. All audio, voiceovers, text and captions must be in English.



#### STEP 3

Upload your video to an online video sharing platform (such as YouTube). The format of the video is up to you, but ensure that the video is unlisted and remember that the final submission video must not break any rules or laws.



#### STEP 4

Consent is required. The necessary form is provided within the Terms and Conditions detailed on the next page.

#### ROUND TWO - National final

Finalists, announced in mid-February 2026, will present their ideas live to a distinguished panel of Monash academics, alumni and industry leaders at the National Final at the end of March 2026 in Taipei. All teams that submitted an entry will be contacted with an update when the final event details are confirmed.

The winning team will then receive a trip to Melbourne, Australia, to compete in the Change It Challenge Global Final in late July/early August 2026.



#### **GRAND PRIZE**

The winning team of the National Final will be given the opportunity to spend a week in Melbourne to compete in the Monash University Change It Challenge Global Final. The Global Final event will consist of winning teams from across the globe, vying for the chance to be named the Change It Challenge champion.

#### The grand prize includes:

- Return flights and visa fee included for winning team and 1 school guardian to Monash University, Australia in late July/early August 2026.
- 4 nights' accommodation, with food and travel costs included.

- Full schedule of activities provided to give the winning team the opportunity to experience life as a Monash student. This includes:
  - Tour of Caulfield and Clayton campuses
  - Sessions for school reps with recruitment teams
  - Sessions for students to meet and greet with current students and teachers
  - Tour of the city of Melbourne, including a tour of Monash College
- Global Challenge Opportunity to compete in the Global Final against winning teams from around the world to be named the Change It Challenge champion.



#### Change It Challenge RULES AND GUIDELINES



Entries can comprise individuals OR teams (note max of 3 students per team).

All Round One entries will be judged by the Monash University selection committee.

Entries open on Monday, 3 November 2025 and close on Friday, 30 January 2026.

#### (2) ROUND TWO

Finalists will be announced in mid-February 2026 to present at National Final at the end of March 2026. All teams that submitted an entry will be contacted with an update when the final event details are confirmed.

Finalists in this round must deliver their three minute video presentation in-person in front of the judges. After the presentation, there will be an additional three minutes added where you will take questions from the judging panel.

Once all finalists have presented, the judging panel will deliberate and then name the winning team, who will be awarded the prize of a trip to Melbourne, Australia to compete in the Monash University Change It Challenge Global Final.

Presentations will be judged based on the following criteria:

- Relevance of Issue
- Research
- Creativity of Approach
- Quality of Presentation
